MUNICIPAL REFERENDUMS

Town of Roxbury

Question 1: Shall the person holding the office of Town Clerk in the Town of Roxbury be appointed by the Town Board?

Question 2: Shall the person holding the office of Town Treasurer in the Town of Roxbury be appointed by the Town Board?

Town of York

Shall the person holding the combined office of Town Clerk and Town Treasurer in the Town of York be appointed by the Town Board?

Village of Maple Bluff

Under state law, the increase in the levy of the Village of Maple Bluff for the tax to be imposed for the next fiscal year, 2021, is limited to 1.542%, which results in a levy of \$2,501,424. Shall the Village of Maple Bluff be allowed to exceed this limit and increase the levy for the next fiscal year, 2021, for the purpose of reinstatement of one police officer and one fire officer, adding one police officer, establishing competitive wage rates for administration, fire and public works personnel, recuperating loss of transportation aid and adequately funding health, education and retirement liabilities, by a total of 34.477%, which results in a levy of \$3,363,833, and on an ongoing basis, include the increase of \$862,409 for each fiscal year going forward?

SCHOOL DISTRICT REFERENDUMS

Deerfield Community School District

RESOLUTION TO EXCEED REVENUE CAP COMMENCING WITH THE 2020-21 SCHOOL YEAR BY AN AMOUNT OF \$500,000

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of the Deerfield Community School District, Dane County, Wisconsin, that the final school district budget shall include an amount not to exceed \$500,000 in excess of the revenue limits imposed by Section 121.91 of the Wisconsin Statutes each year for a period of five years on a nonrecurring basis, beginning with the 2020-21 school year and ending with the 2024-25 school year, for the purpose of maintaining instructional programs, maintaining facilities, upgrading technology, and meeting the operating expense requirements incurred when properly operating the educational facilities of the District during these school years.

Question: Shall the School Board of the Deerfield Community School District be authorized to exceed the revenue limit under Section 121.91 of the Wisconsin Statutes for a period of five years by an amount of \$500,000 beginning with the 2020-21 school year on a nonrecurring basis for the purpose of maintaining instructional programs, maintaining facilities, upgrading technology, and meeting the operating expense requirements incurred when properly operating the educational facilities of the District during these school years as provided in the foregoing resolution?

Madison Metropolitan School District

Question 1: Shall the Madison Metropolitan School District, Dane County, Wisconsin be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$6,000,000 for the 2020-2021 school year; by an additional \$8,000,000 (for a total of \$14,000,000) for the 2021-2022 school year; by an additional \$9,000,000 (for a total of \$23,000,000) for the 2022-2023 school year; and by an additional \$10,000,000 (for a total of \$33,000,000) for the 2023-2024 school year and thereafter, for recurring purposes consisting of operational and maintenance expenses?

Question 2: Shall the Madison Metropolitan School District, Dane County, Wisconsin be authorized to issue pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$317,000,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a school building and facility improvement project consisting of: renovations and additions at all four high schools, including safety and security improvements, plumbing/heating and cooling, science labs and classrooms, athletic, theater, and environmental sustainability improvements; land acquisition for and construction of a new elementary school located near Rimrock Road to relocate an existing elementary school; remodeling the district owned Hoyt School to relocate Capital High; and acquisition of furnishings, fixtures and equipment?

Monona Grove School District

Shall the Monona Grove School District, Dane County, Wisconsin be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$3,700,000 per year for four years beginning with the 2021-2022 school year and ending with the 2024-2025 school year, for non-recurring purposes consisting of maintaining current programs and staff and operational expenses?

Pecatonica Area School District

Shall the Pecatonica Area School District be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$490,000 beginning in the 2021-2022 school year for recurring purposes?

Waukegan Community School District

Shall the Waukegan Community School District, Dane County, Wisconsin be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$2,127,502 per year for five years beginning with the 2020-2021 school year and ending with the 2024-2025 school year, for non-recurring purposes consisting of operational and maintenance expenses?

Wisconsin Heights School District

Shall the Wisconsin Heights School District, Dane and Iowa Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to issue pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$27,000,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a school building and facility improvement project consisting of: construction of an elementary school addition at the existing Middle/High School; renovations, building infrastructure and capital maintenance improvements at the Middle/High School, including roof replacement, HVAC improvements and Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) updates; site improvements; and acquisition of furnishings, fixtures, and equipment?
